**W**ashington, D.C. (AP) — President Bill Clinton on Wednesday hailed the signing of a peace agreement between Israel and the Palestinians as a "brave gamble" that could end decades of bloodshed.

Clinton, flanked by Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin and Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat, signed the agreement in the White House. The agreement, known as the Oslo Accords, marks a historic moment in the Middle East peace process.

High over Texas and just short of home, space shuttle *Columbia* fell to pieces Saturday, raining debris over hundreds of miles of countryside. Seven astronauts perished—a stunning loss for a country and world already staggered by tragedy.

The catastrophe occurred 39 miles above the Earth, in the last 16 minutes of the 28th mission, as the spaceship glided in for a landing in Florida. In the horror and in its backdrop of a crystal-blue sky, the day school one almost exactly 17 years before on which the *Challenger* exploded.
