My Story and What October 7th Means for the Future of Israel with Wexner Alum, Gen. (res.) **Noam Tibon**, one of the retired Israeli generals who went into combat zone on October 7 and saved lives.

Noam Tibon, WIF, Class 13 Noam Tibon is retired from the IDF from his last position as the Head of the IDF's West Bank Divisions. Prior to this, he was the Nachal Brigade Commander in the IDF holding the rank of Colonel. Among his military distinctions, he was the Hebron Area Brigade Commander and a paratroop battalion commander. He received a B.A. in History from Haifa University and graduated as a distinguished student from the Marines corps Command and Staff College in Quantico, Virginia. 11:00 am Drive to Glilot to the headquarters of the **Ahim Laneshek** – Brother and Sisters in Arms – Community Coordination Center, which become one of the main sources of communal support and problem for Israelis throughout the country.

- Lunch at the **Greko Restaurant** in Tel Aviv.
- 2:00 pm Meet with Gen (res.), Wexner Alum and former MK, **Yair Golan,** a retired Israeli general who went into the Nova Party combat zone to save lives and is viewed as a possible next leader of the Israeli Zionist left.

Yair Golan, WIF Class 14 Yair Golan is a general in the Israel Defense Forces and currently the Deputy Chief of General Staff. Was the commander of the Northern Front Command and before that the Commander of the IDF's Home Front Command. Prior to this appointment, he was the Judea and Samaria Division Commander. Mr. Golan is a career officer for the IDF holding the rank of Major-General. Since his commissioning in 1982 Mr. Golan served in a variety of command and staff assignments. In the years 1983–1986 he commanded a paratroop platoon and company. He was appointed deputy battalion commander in 1988 and a G3 officer for the 35th paratroop brigade in 1991. During the years 1992–1993 he commanded the 890-paratroop battalion and then an infantry officer course. In the years 1994–1995 he served as G3 officer for Judea and Samaria Headquarters and in 1996 he was appointed as a territorial brigade commander in the eastern sector of the security zone of southern Lebanon. In 2000 Mr. Golan was appointed as the commander of the Nahal brigade and led it until July 2002. In July 2003 he became commander of the Galilee Division. Mr. Golan graduated from the IDF Command and Staff College and the U.S. Army War College in Pennsylvania, and holds a B.A. degree in Political Science from Tel-Aviv University. He holds a Master in Public Administration from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government as a Wexner Israel Fellow.

On October 7, 2023, the same day that the October 2023 Gaza–Israel conflict began, Golan has put on his uniform and arrived in his private vehicle to the Gaza envelope, which was subject to a surprise attack on Israel, and rescued survivors in the area of the massacre at the Nature Festival near Re'im. He described what he saw as very difficult scenes and claimed that the battle of that day was the worst defeat of the State of Israel ever.

THE WEXNER FOUNDATION

4:30 pm *Israel's Challenges in a Post October 7th Region,* with General (Ret) **Eitan Dangot,** former Coordinator of Government Affairs in the Territories, and Military Secretary to three Ministers of Defense.

Major General Eitan Dangot was born in Tel Aviv in 1960 and began his service in the IDF in 1978 in the artillery corps. He served in a number of command positions, including during the First Lebanese War, and rose up the ranks. After serving as the IDF attaché in the Netherlands, Dangot returned to the artillery corps, filling two of the most senior positions in the corps.

In 1999 he was transferred to the General Staff, and in 2002 he received the rank of Brigadier General and was appointed Chief of Staff of the Home Front Command. In this capacity he led a number of rescue team delegations to disaster areas (both natural and terror inflicted) in various countries around the world.

In 2004 he became the Military Secretary to the Minister of Defense and served in this position for three ministers, Shaul Mofaz (toward the end of the Second Intifada), Amir Peretz (during the Second Lebanese War) and Ehud Barak (during Cast Lead in Gaza).

In 2009 he was promoted to the rank of Major General and the position of Coordinator of Government Activities in the Territories, a position he filled for five years until January 2014.

Major General Dangot has a Bachelor's degree in computer science and economics and an MBA, both from Bar Ilan University. He is married to Orna and has five children.
